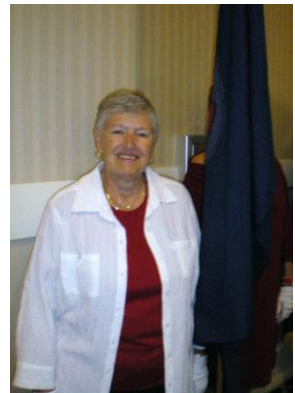

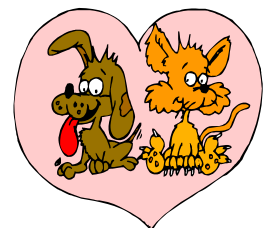

The results of the ESA Foundation Scholarship awards were announced in June. Michigan Students have won six of the 165 scholarships awarded for 2011. There were 8,656 applications received, nationwide, out of which 7,735 that were judged.

This year the former Foundation Counselor, Joann Zaleski, processed 275 applications. Joann distributed scholarship information to 77 schools. As the new Foundation Counselor, I have some big shoes to fill, huh?

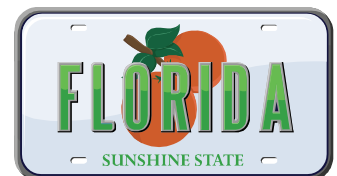
